The Orland Township Scholarship Foundation Board of Directors are pleased to announce that \$16,500 in scholarships will be awarded to Orland Township high school students from the 2011 graduating class. It was unanimously agreed upon by the foundation members to award: 1 - \$2,000, 8 - \$1,000 and 13 - \$500 scholarships, for a total of 22 scholarships!

The Orland Township Scholarship Foundation will select and award scholarship recipients based on a combination of the applicant's leadership skills, dedication to community service, academic focus, participation in extracurricular activities, recommendations from school representatives, volunteer supervisors or employers, an assigned essay question response and any other pertinent information requested within the application. Students faced with hardships will be given strong consideration. The award program reflects the Orland Township Scholarship Foundation's ongoing commitment to education while honoring Orland Township youth who have gone above and beyond during their high school experience, both inside and outside of the classroom.

All scholarship applications must be postmarked by the deadline date of March 2, 2011 or dropped off at the Orland Township Administrative Office, 14807 Ravinia Avenue, Orland Park, IL, 60462. Office hours are Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Tuesday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**

- 1. Applicants must reside within the boundaries of Orland Township.
- 2. Immediate family members of the Board of Trustees, committee members of the Scholarship Foundation and employees of Orland Township are not eligible to participate in the scholarship competition.
- 3. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors.
- 4. Applicants may be called upon for a personal interview with the Board of Directors.
- 5. Award winners must enroll as full-time students at a college, university, trade or vocational school.
- 6. The scholarship selection committee awards the scholarship and reserves the right to disqualify any individual who does not meet the established criteria.
- 7. The scholarships will be awarded based upon a combination of the applicant's leadership, volunteerism, academic focus, participation in extracurricular activities, recommendations from a school representative, volunteer supervisor or employer, as well as the essay and the information provided within the application. Financial hardship will be given strong consideration.
- 8. The scholarship awards will be forwarded to the college, university, trade or vocational school of your choice and must be used for tuition, books or fees only.
- 9. Applications must be filled out entirely, and returned to: Orland Township Scholarship Foundation, 14807 Ravinia Ave., Orland Park, IL 60462. **Deadline for filing is March 2, 2011 by 4:30 p.m.**
- 10. Answer the questions clearly and succinctly. If additional space is required, attach an additional sheet and label with your name, the appropriate category and number.
